Always Hire a Professional Tree Service

Researching a tree service on the internet can very quickly become overwhelming. There are so many options! Who is reliable? Experienced? Trustworthy? Affordable?

Although of course we recommend ourselves to cater to your tree care needs,



we understand that you have many options and factors to consider. We'd like to provide with some basic buying tips when you are making a decision.

1) Be wary of anyone who is not a full-time, professional tree climber.

There are a large number of jack-of-all-trade type contractors that are happy to take your business. But climbing and cutting down trees dangerous work that can easily go awry when not performed by someone well versed in tree cutting and culling techniques. What you may save up front may cost you in damage to your yard, home, and sanity.

2) When you hire a tree service, make sure they are properly licensed and insured.

This information should be on their website or they should be able to give you a copy. If the vendor you are considering cannot immediately furnish this documentation when prompted, consider this a giant red flag and continue your search elsewhere.

3) When getting a price, if it sounds almost too good to be true, it very well could be.

We have helped many people in the Hampton Roads area who have had the misfortune of placing their trust in a vendor that grossly undercut the competition. In these case the tree work was only partially completed when the vendor demanded full payment. Once the money was given, the vendor disappeared. We hate seeing these situations so I would like to stress that if you do opt for the lowest price option, please make sure you do due diligence on the history, legitimacy, and background of the company - and *never* provide payment until the job is 100% complete.

We certainly hope you to at least have a free consultation with The Whole 9 Tree Service when selecting your vendor, but more than that we want our neighbors to be treated fairly and honestly. Please follow these guidelines when selecting your tree service.

How much does it cost to remove a tree?

There are many factors that go into the overall cost of removing a tree: size, location, health, risk, overall shape, surrounding structures. Some trees may cost

\$150 dollars to remove from your home while others cost \$5000. Here is an in depth article about why these prices vary from tree to tree.

Every tree is different so every price is different. Most tree services have a minimum price for a tree. So if you have a 10 feet tall Bradford Pear Tree you will probably get a minimum price. What that price is varies from company to company but is usually in the neighborhood of \$150.

It may seem a little tedious, but there are many factors to think about when judging the size of a tree. The width of the trunk, the height of the tree, the width of the crown, and how crowded the crown is. Sometimes a 50 foot tree with a 1.5 foot diameter trunk will cost more than an 80 foot tree with a 2 foot diameter. This is because of the crown of the tree. Some trees grow many branches that overlap one another. This makes the job harder and more time consuming for the tree removal service.

The location of the tree is very important when factoring in the cost. A tree in the backyard will almost always be more expensive than the same tree in your front yard. It is harder to get equipment in a backyard. Maybe you have a fence with a small gate that debris has to carried through. The further away the tree is from where your tree service provider can bring their equipment, the farther the cost goes up.

The health of a tree factors in to cost sometimes. If the tree is in an area that cannot be accessed by a bucket truck or crane then the tree must be climbed. Dead trees are dangerous to climb and the more dangerous the work the more expensive it is to remove the tree.

The surrounding area of the tree is a big factor to assess when getting a quote to cut down a tree. If the tree is near and/or hanging over structures like your home, shed, patio, pool, driveway etc. then the tree must be cut down branch by branch using ropes to lower the limbs down. Obviously this takes time and the longer it takes to cut down a tree the higher the price will be.


Most tree services will execute a job with around 4 guys. One man climbing and performing the cutting down of the tree, 2 guys hauling debris to a place it can be processed and one man running the equipment(chipper, bobcat, dump truck). The average tree company will try to get around \$200 - \$300(depending on risk) per hour for his guys to be working on your tree. This money will cover his labor fees, gas fees, dump fees, and general overhead(liability for the business, insurance on the trucks, maintenance for his heavy equipment, advertising for his

business, taxes, etc.) This may seem expensive but you might be suprised at how much an efficient, well run tree service can accomplish in an hour.
